

ORDINANCE NO 14: An Ordinance to prevent indecent exposure of persons in the Village of Hokah.

The President and Trustees of the Village of Hokah do ordain as follows.

SECTION 1.

No person shall within the Corporate limits of the Village of Hokah rudely or indecently expose any part of his or her person to public view either intentionally or willfully or by swimming or bathing in the Root River or what is commonly known as Harpers Creek or the Mill Pond.

SECTION 2.

An any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to summary arrest and restraint and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more then five (5) dollars nore more than ten (10) dollars – and in default of the payment of such fine shall be imprisoned in the Common Jail of Houston County or in the jail of the Village of Hokah not less than on day nore more than thirty days, at the discretion of the Court.
