

ORDINANCE NO 22: An Ordinance to protect sidewalks and shade trees, within the corporate limits of the Village of Hokah.

The President and Trustees of the Village of Hokah do ordain as follows.

SECTION 1.

All persons are prohibited from tearing up or injuring the planks or stringers of sidewalks in said village or driving riding or leading any horse, cow, or ox, or other animal on any sidewalk in the Village of Hokah other than to cross the same.

SECTION 2.

All persons are prohibited from hitching any horses or oxen or other animals to any fence, gate, or tree not belonging to themselves within the corporate limits of said Village.

SECTION 3.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine for each and every offence in a sum not less than one (1) dollar nor more than twenty five (25) dollars, and in default of the payment thereof may be imprisoned for a period not exceeding thirty days.

SECTION 4.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force ten days after being duly posted.
