

AMENDED APRIL 15TH 1872

ORDINANCE NO. 4: An Ordinance to prohibit the vending or dealing in Vinous, Spiritous, Malt, fermented or intoxicating drinks.

The President and Trustees of the Village of Hokah do ordain as follows

SECTION 1.

No Person share, sell, vending, deal in or expose for sale, barter or give away within the corporate limits of the Village of Hokah any Vinous, Spiritour, Malt, fermented or intoxicating drinks or liquors. Without first having obtained a licence so to do from the Turstees of the Village of Hokah.

SECTION 2.

The licence required to be paid by Section 1 of this Ordinance shall be as follows, Each person engaged in or who shall hereafter engage in the vending or dealing in Vinous, Malt fermented Spiritous or intoxicating drings. Shall annally pay unto the village Treasure the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars.

SECTION 3.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished agreeably with Chapter 16 of the revised Statues of the State of Minnesota and it is further ordained that any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be sufficient grounds to revoke any licence issued under the provisions thereof by the Board of Trustees of Said Village.
