

ORDINANCE NO. 5: An Ordinance regulating the Keeping of Billard Tables, etc.  
The President and Trustees of the Village of Hokah do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.

No persons shall erect or keep or presuit to be erected or kept upon his premises, within the corporate limits of the Village of Hokah, Any Billiards Table, Bagatelle Table, or Bowling Alley, or Ten pin alley, for the purpose of allowing any game be played on such table, or in such alley without first having obtained a license so to do from the Trustees of Said Village.

SECTION 2.

The license required to be paid by Section one of this Ordinance shall be as follows, for a Billiard Table, for a Bagatelle Table, Bowling Alley, Nine or Ten pen Alley, Ten dollars per year for each such Table or Alley.

SECTION 3.

Any Person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall pay a penalty to the Village of Hokah a sum in double the amount of any license required to be paid by him under and by virtue of this Ordinance in default of paymeht of any such fine shall be imprisoned in the common Jail of Houston County for the term of Three Months and until such fine and costs of prosecution are paidl.
