

ORDINANCE NO. 8: An Ordinance to secure the Health of the Villaeg. The President and Trustees of the Village of Hokah do ordain as follows.

SECTION 1.

That whenever in the opinion of the Trustees of the Village of Hokah it may necessary for the purpose of promoting and securing the health of the Villaeg or of preventing the Introduction and spread of contagious malignant dangerous or infectious diseases they may appoint a health office. Who shall be a qualified physician and shall have power to take the most efficient measures for the safety of the Village and to prevent the introduction of such disease and the Village Marshall is hereby required to aid and assist such officer in the discharge all such duty.

SECTION 2.

That if any person having any such disease, shall be brought into the Village by any Rail Car or other conveyance the Conductor of such Car or person having charge of such conveyance, shall before leaving such diseases person, within the Village Coroporation, give notice to the Health Officer of the Village, who may if he shall deem it required for the health of the Village, order that such diseased person shall be conveyed to some proper place and if necessary provide proper attendance and care for the same and any person who shall neglect or refuse to give such notice as is herein required, shall be subject to a fine not less than Twenty Dollars.

SECTION 3.

Any person who shall knowingly introduce or aid or assist in introducing into the Village, the Small Pox or any contagious malignant dangerous or infectious disease or shall knowingly and designedly conceal the aknowledge he may have of such diseases being within the Village without forthwith giving notice ehereof to the health officer, shall on conviction, be subject to a fine of not less than thirty or more than On-Hundred Dollars.
